



Commissioning Update on Somerset's new Domestic Abuse Service

In January 2015, Knightstone took over the management of all the Somerset County Council commissioned domestic abuse services in the county. People who need some support as a result of experiencing domestic abuse can expect these services to be available:

- Accommodation across the county for women and men and their children who need to flee their homes, through a mixture of refuge and safe-house properties.
- Specialist community based support on a one-to-one or a group basis for female and male victims who want to stay in their homes.
- Support for children and young people who are affected by domestic abuse, and parenting support programmes (Knightstone Housing will be working in partnership with Barnardo's to deliver these).
- A dedicated work programme for perpetrators of domestic abuse to give them the opportunity to change their attitudes and behaviour.

Key changes for this service include:

- Single point of access to all elements of the service.
- Services are provided as a "whole-system approach" enabling a comprehensive assessment of needs, and support planning catered around the individual.

Somerset Domestic Abuse Service Access Pathway

Professional recognises that their client maybe at risk of domestic abuse

Agency to complete CAADA DASH Risk Indicator Checklist (RIC)

Take the following actions dependant on RIC Score

Score - 0-13

Refer to Somerset Integrated Domestic Abuse Service (SIDAS) via Hub

{attaching your CAADA Ric & completed SIDAS initial referral form}

Or telephone 0800 6949 999
The SIDAS will assess appropriate support/ service needed – ie:

- Community Outreach Support
- Refuge accommodation (female only)
- Safe house accommodation (male & female)

New National Helpline

Revenge porn helpline launched by government In February 2015

The specialist helpline is the latest in a series of measures taken by the government to tackle the growing problem of people sharing intimate images online as a way of seeking revenge or ridiculing individuals

The helpline will liaise with law enforcement and media companies to remove content where possible, and offer details of free legal advice. It will also point individuals to additional support services, such as Women's Aid, Stalking helpline or Relate if needed.



On Tuesdays groups are being run AM for Inroduction to Change and PM Mindfulness


Wednesdays are for clients needing 1-1 sessions or an appointment for a Doctor


Somerset Domestic Abuse Service Performance

Somerset Domestic Abuse Outreach (non-IDVA) Referral Numbers by District




For the 9 months January to September 2014, there were a total of 284 referrals made to Somerset's IDAS Outreach support. The areas of Mendip and West Somerset mirror the referrals to the IDVA service, where they are similarly low.

Feelings of Safety (Outreach – non IDVA)




The majority of service users (88%) reported either feeling "much" or "somewhat" safer as a result of the support from the IDAS outreach.

Somerset Independent Domestic Violence Advisor Service



For the 9 months April to December, there were a total of 543 referrals made to Somerset's IDVA service, with 60% being from just the two districts of South Somerset and Sedgemoor.



Many domestic abuse victims experience a mixture of abuse types – so although the vast majority of referrals indicated that the abuse was physical in its type, it's unlikely to have been the sole form of abuse taking place. This maybe indicative of people considering that it's only serious enough to access services when physical harm occurs.
