He is of African-Caribbean heritage and has a passion for spreading health awareness regarding Prostate Cancer throughout the African-Caribbean community. He has been a part of the Friends of Caswell Thompson group since its inception. The group hosts annual Prostate Cancer health awareness days in Bristol for a number of years.



Jonathan Aning

Mr Jonathan Aning is a Consultant Urological Surgeon at the Bristol Urological Institute. He specialises in the treatment of prostate and bladder cancer, including robotic and open surgery. He trained in Urology in the South West of England. He completed the Uro-oncology fellowship at the Department of Urological Sciences, University of British Columbia, Vancouver, Canada in 2013 before returning to the UK to practice. Jonathan has active research interests in prostate cancer, primarily in surgical outcomes, the optimal management of high risk prostate cancer. He is a principle investigator for a number of clinical trials, a honorary senior clinical lecturer at Bristol University and a member of the BAUS committee.
