

getUBetter APP Progress Report

- getUBetter is now installed across 51 Somerset GP Practices (installation means that the link unique to the individual GP Practices can be sent via AccuRX, Practices can put their unique link on their website and, if wanted, posters / leaflets have been sent)
- As of Friday 24th November
 - 1,852 individuals have been provided access to the app / clicked on the initial front page
 - And of these, 1,280 have completed the registration process and are using help and support available
 - This means an activation rate of 69% (which is higher than the getUBetter average of 66%)
- 8 x GP Practices have over 40 individuals signed-up and using the app

Though clinicians can refer patients via [getUBetter - Request Access preselection](#), the preferred route is for practices to sign up and install getUBetter, so that a practice specific accuRx link can be provided.
